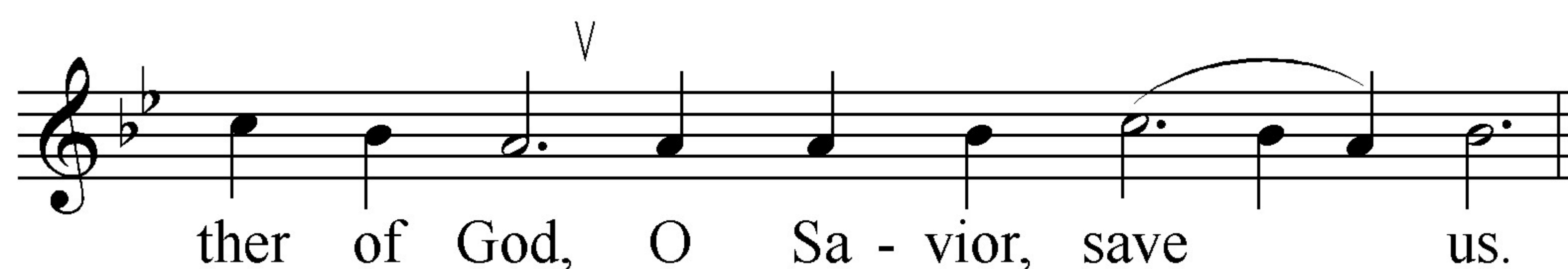
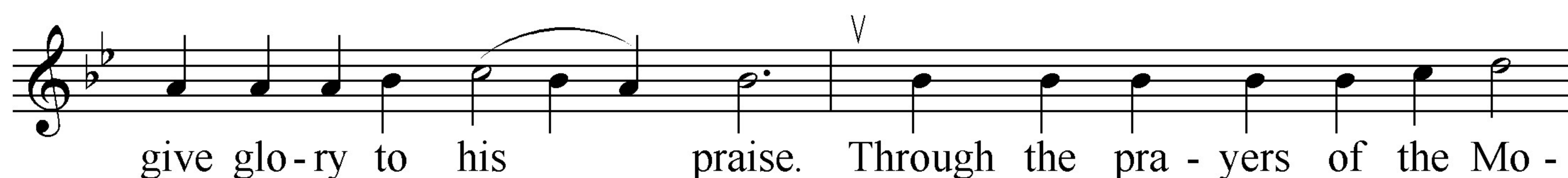
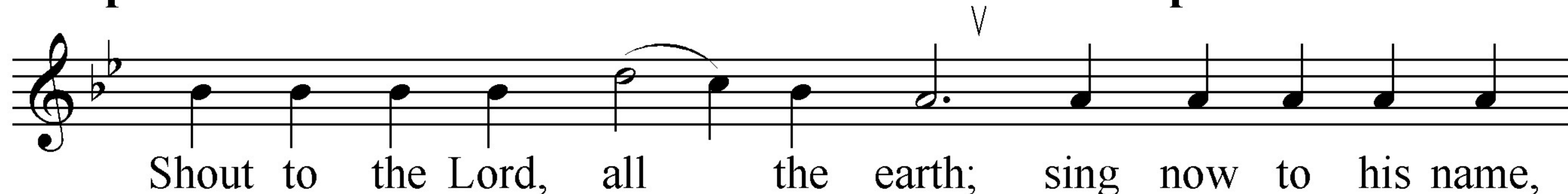
**Troparion "Christ is risen" is sung at the beginning:**

**1st time by the celebrant, 2nd time by the faithful**

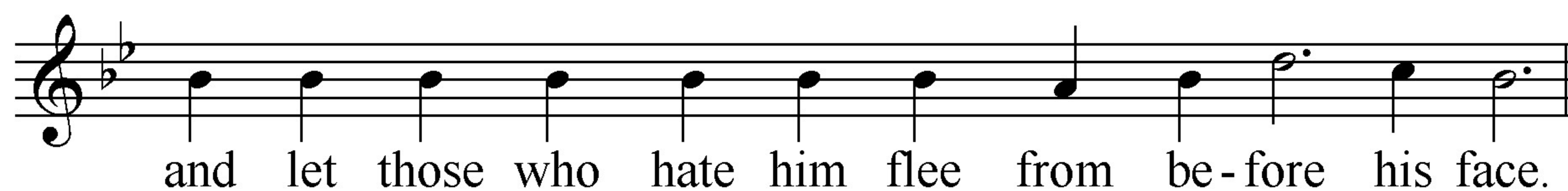
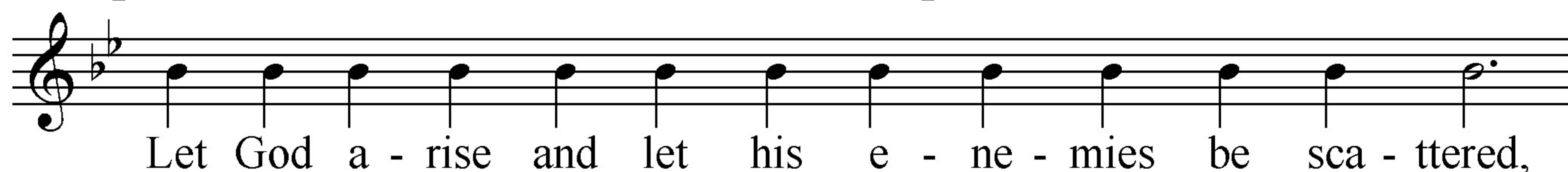
**3rd time: 1st half by the celebrant then 2nd half by the faithful**



**Antiphone 1 - verses and refrain can be recited in this pattern**

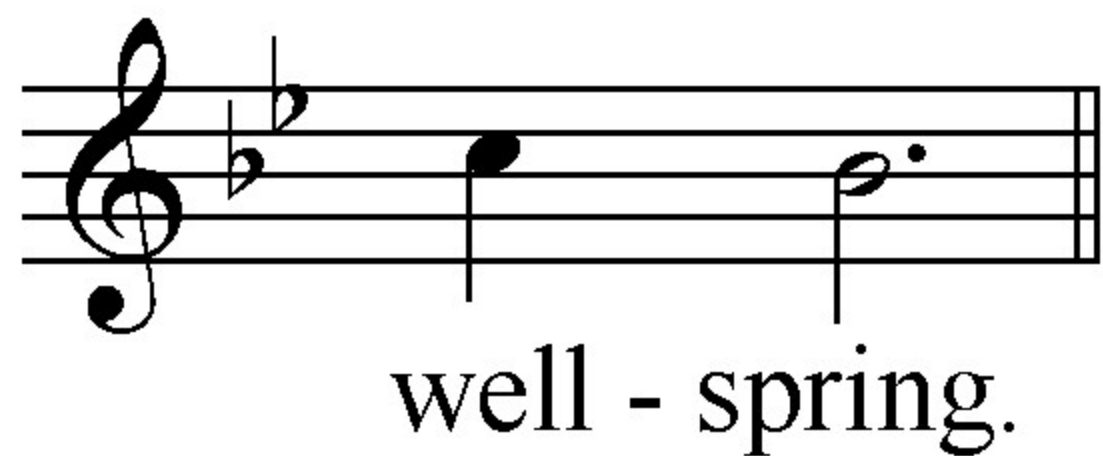
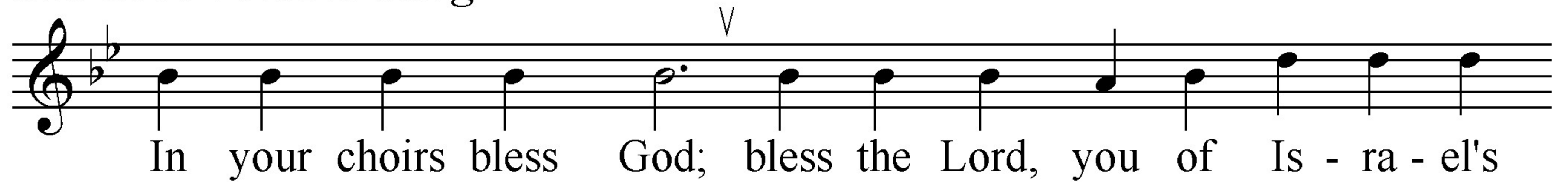


**Antiphone 3 - verses can be recited in this pattern**

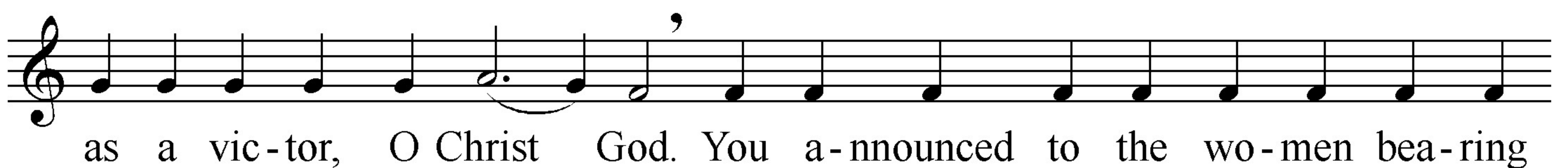
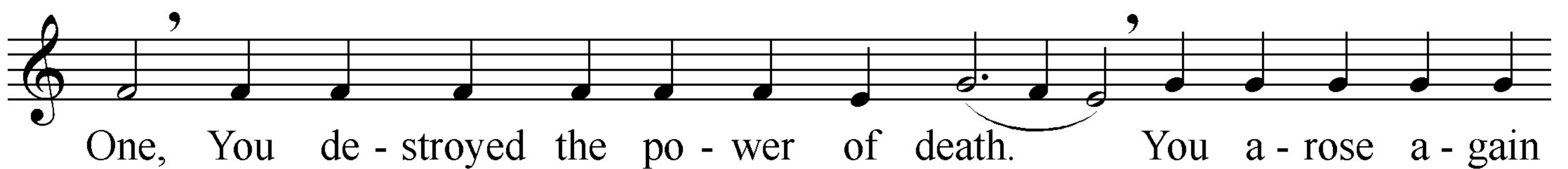
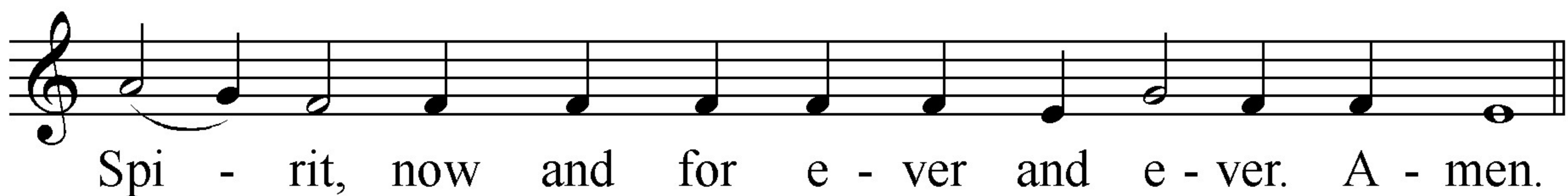
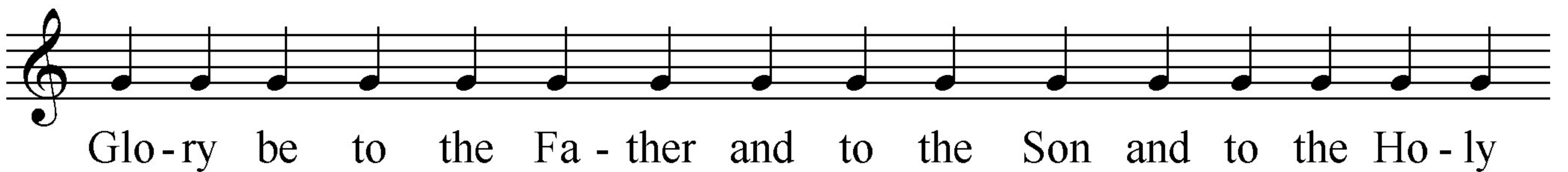


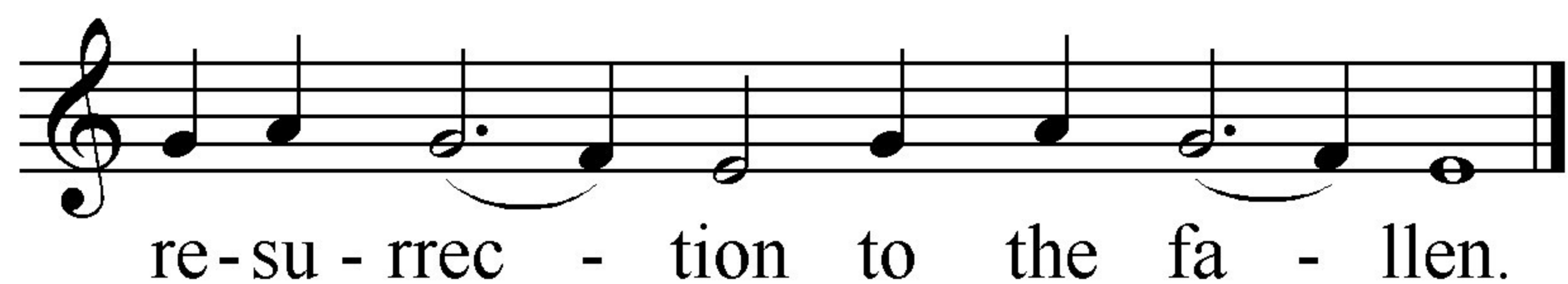
**The troparion "Christ is risen" is sung after each verse**

entrance verse is sung

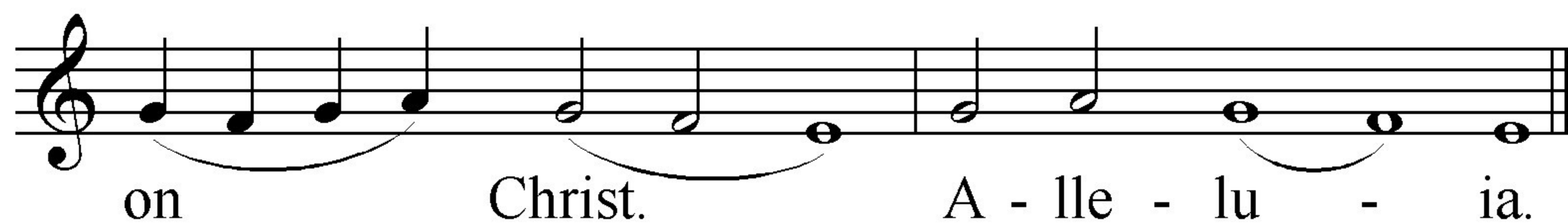


Then the troparion "Christ is risen" is sung, and then  
Kontakion (Tone 8)

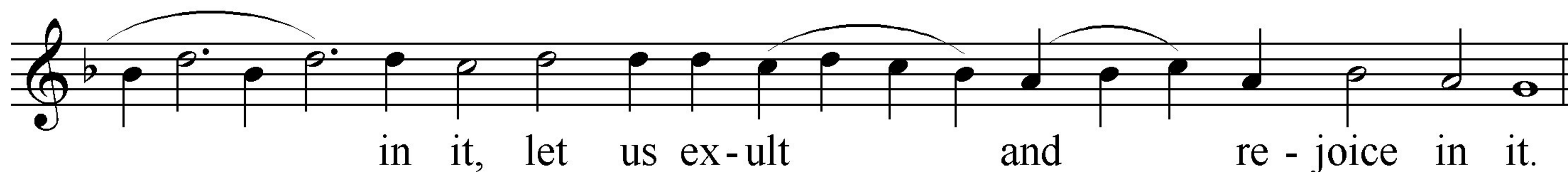
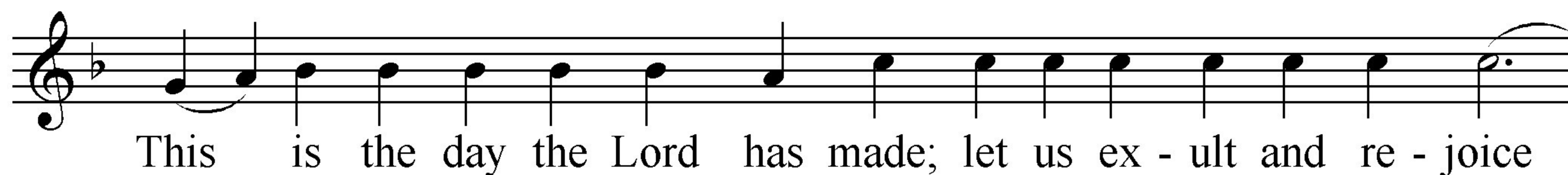




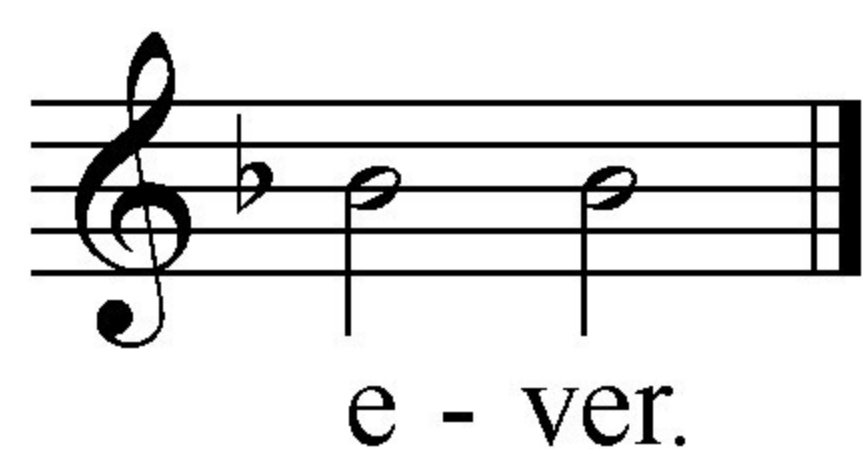
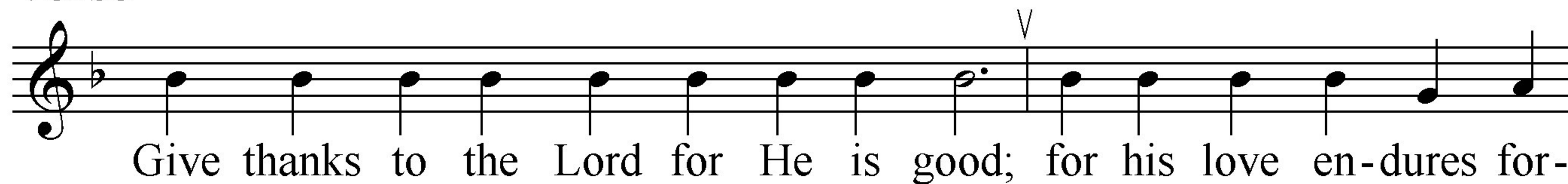
**Instead of "Holy God" "All you" is sung (and every day of the Bright Week)**

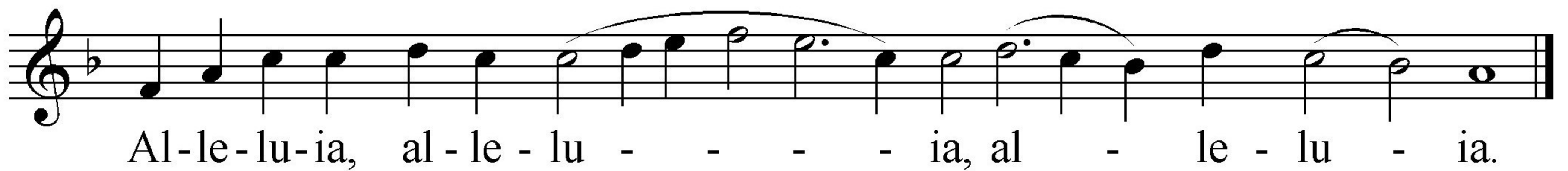


**Prokimenon (Tone 8)**

**Instead of "Blessed is He ..." and "We have seen..." "Christ is risen"  
is sung ONE time.**

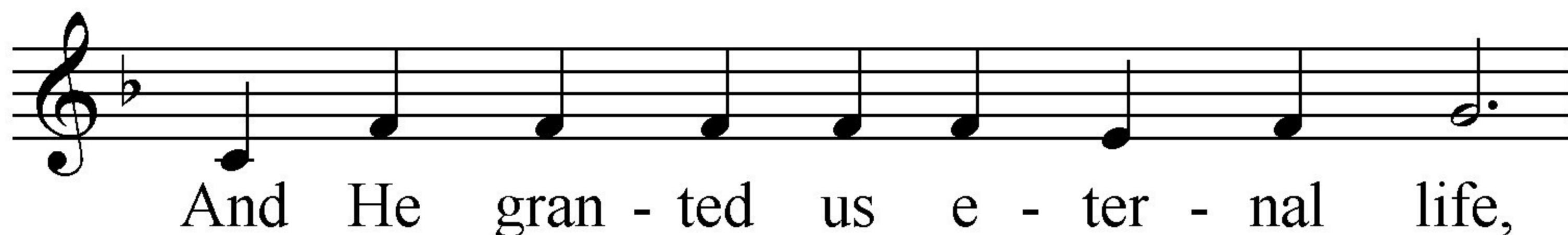
**Instead of "May our mouths be filled" and "Blessed be the name"  
"Christ is risen" is sung THREE times**

**Instead of "Glory be to the Father..., now and for ever... Lord, have mercy...  
Give the blessing." "Christ is risen from the dead! By death He conquered  
death, and to those in the graves He granted life. Lord, have mercy...  
Give the blessing." is sung (till Ascension Thursday)**

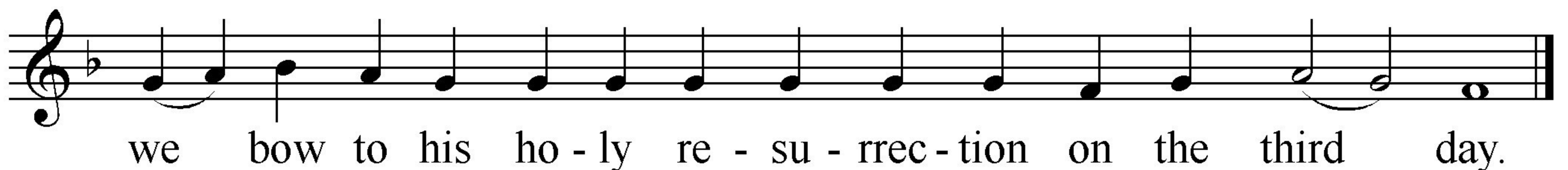
**After final "Amen" of the Divine Liturgy "Christ is risen" is sung
